REGULATIONS FOR THE LUNACY WARDS OF THE *Bendigo*  
*Gold District General Hospital*

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the

*29<sup>th</sup>* day of *December* 1873.

WHEREAS by the 18th section of *The Lunacy Statute* it is enacted among other things that the committee, or other body, or the persons in whose hands shall be vested the management of any public hospital, may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, provide wards for the temporary reception of lunatic patients, and thereupon the Governor in Council may from time to time make and alter and rescind orders and regulations for the registration, treatment, dietary, and inspection of patients in such wards, and for the discharge, or transfer, or removal of patients therefrom: And whereas the committee in charge of the

*Bendigo Gold District General Hospital at Sandhurst*

with the consent of the Governor in Council, have provided wards for the temporary reception of lunatic patients: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order make the regulations following:—

1. *Appointment of Visitors.*—The Governor in Council may appoint a police magistrate and two other justices to be visitors of the wards provided as aforesaid for the reception of lunatic patients; and every such visitor may remove, and on the death, resignation, or removal of any such visitor may appoint some other person being a police magistrate or justice, as the case may be, in his place; and two of such visitors, or one of such visitors being a police magistrate, shall visit such wards once at least in every calendar month.

2. *Books to be kept.*—There shall be kept in the above-mentioned hospital, for lunatic patients confined in the wards provided as above, the books following, that is to say:—

A Register of Patients,

A Medical Journal,

A Register of Discharges, Removals, and Deaths;

and such books shall be kept according to forms to be supplied by the Chief Secretary for that purpose, which shall be so far as the same may be applicable the forms in use for the time being in public asylums under the provisions of the Lunacy Statute.

3. *Registers of patients and of discharges, removals, and deaths to be kept by secretary.*—The register of patients, and the register of discharges, removals, and deaths shall be kept by the secretary of the hospital, and shall be inspected and signed every month by the surgeon of such hospital, and by one of the visitors.

4. *Medical journal.*—The medical journal shall be kept by the surgeon of such hospital, and he shall cause to be entered therein, once at least in every week, a statement showing the date of such statement; the number of lunatic patients of each sex therein; the wards provided as aforesaid; the name of every such patient who shall then be or shall have been since the last entry under restraint or in seclusion therein, and when and for what period and reasons, and in case of restraint by what means, and the name of every patient under medical treatment therein, and for what bodily disorder; the condition of such wards, and every death, injury, and violence which shall have happened to or affected any such patient since the last preceding entry.

5. *Visitors' book.*—As often as any of the visitors of the wards provided as aforesaid shall visit the same, he shall sign an entry specifying the date of his so visiting such wards in a book to be kept for the purpose, to be called the visitors' book.

6. *Copies of registers to be certified every month.*—Copies of the register of patients and of the register of discharges, removals, and deaths, and of the medical journal, shall be made during the succeeding calendar month for transmission to the inspector of asylums, hospitals, and licensed houses in Victoria, and shall be certified by the surgeon of such hospital, and one of the visitors under their hands.

7. *Monthly transmission of accounts and certified copies of registers to inspector.*—The committee of such hospital shall cause to be made out every calendar month an account of the charges to which such hospital has been put in the maintenance

during the preceding calendar month of lunatic patients received into the wards provided as aforesaid; and shall cause such account, together with the copies certified as aforesaid of the register of patients and the register of discharges, removals, and deaths, to be transmitted to the inspector of asylums, hospitals, and licensed houses in Victoria.

8. *Power to visitors to discharge lunatic patients.*—Any two visitors of the wards provided as aforesaid, or any visitor being a police magistrate, acting with the advice of the surgeon of such hospital, or of two legally qualified medical practitioners, may, on the application of the committee of such hospital, order the discharge of any lunatic patient detained in any ward provided as aforesaid; and may in case of ordering such discharge on the ground that any relation or friend of such lunatic patient is desirous of taking such lunatic patient under his own care, require as the condition of such discharge that such relation or friend enter into a bond to Her Majesty with or without a surety or sureties, to be approved by the visitors or visitor ordering such discharge, in such penal sum as such visitor or visitors may think fit, conditioned that such lunatic patient shall be properly taken care of, and shall be prevented from doing injury to himself or to others.

9. *Power to visitors to transfer lunatic patients.*—Any two visitors of the hospital, or any visitor being a police magistrate, may, on the application of the committee of such hospital, order that any lunatic patient confined in any ward provided as aforesaid, be transferred to and detained in any ward provided under the provisions of the Lunacy Statute, in any other hospital for the temporary reception of lunatic patients, or to any public lunatic asylum, and all constables and peace officers shall assist in carrying out any such order.

10. *Persons incurable, &c., to be transferred to an asylum.*—When any lunatic patient detained in any ward provided as aforesaid, not suffering from any disease which renders him unfit to travel, is found to be a congenital idiot or incurably insane, or has been detained in such ward for the space of one month, and is not likely to be cured within fourteen more days, the committee of such hospital shall forthwith apply to the visitor or visitors of such wards as hereinbefore provided to order the transfer of such lunatic patient to some public lunatic asylum, and such visitor or visitors shall order such transfer accordingly.

11. *Report on persons detained more than a month.*—When any lunatic patient is detained in any ward provided as aforesaid for more than one month, the committee of such hospital shall forward to the inspector of asylums, hospitals, and licensed houses a report upon the case of such lunatic patient setting forth the reasons of his detention, and if in the opinion of such inspector the reasons are not sufficient, the said inspector may transfer such lunatic patient to some public lunatic asylum.

12. *Dietary of lunatic patients.*—The dietary of each lunatic patient received into any ward provided as aforesaid shall be according to the scale mentioned in the schedule to these regulations, subject to such alterations as the surgeon of such hospital may from time to time consider necessary for the requirements of such patient.

13. *Treatment of lunatic patients.*—The treatment of all lunatic patients received into the wards provided as aforesaid shall be under the control of the surgeon of such hospital.

14. *Surgeon to visit each patient daily.*—The surgeon of such hospital shall see each lunatic patient detained in the wards provided as aforesaid every day.
