DISCUSSION

(The following is a summary of the results of the experiments.)

The first experiment was designed to determine the effect of the concentration of the solution on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table I.

The second experiment was designed to determine the effect of the temperature on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table II.

The third experiment was designed to determine the effect of the catalyst on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table III.

TABLE I

Effect of concentration on the rate of reaction. The rate of reaction was measured by the volume of gas evolved per unit time.

The results show that the rate of reaction increases with increasing concentration of the solution.

The fourth experiment was designed to determine the effect of the surface area of the solid reactant on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table IV.

The results show that the rate of reaction increases with increasing surface area of the solid reactant.

The fifth experiment was designed to determine the effect of the pressure on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table V.

The results show that the rate of reaction increases with increasing pressure.

The sixth experiment was designed to determine the effect of the nature of the solid reactant on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table VI.

The results show that the rate of reaction varies with the nature of the solid reactant.

The seventh experiment was designed to determine the effect of the nature of the liquid reactant on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table VII.

The results show that the rate of reaction varies with the nature of the liquid reactant.

The eighth experiment was designed to determine the effect of the nature of the catalyst on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table VIII.

The results show that the rate of reaction varies with the nature of the catalyst.

The ninth experiment was designed to determine the effect of the nature of the solvent on the rate of reaction. The results are shown in Table IX.

The results show that the rate of reaction varies with the nature of the solvent.
