Sir I have the honor to report for the information of His Ex<sup>ty</sup> the Governor that hearing some blacks had been killed in an encounter with white people near the stations occupied by Mr Goldwyn about 80 miles from this I sent out a summons to the Superintendent Mr Coppock by some Mounted Police to attend here to inform me of the fact, they met Mr Coppock on the road into town and have proceeded on according to my directions to ascertain what other parties are acquainted with the circumstances that they may also give their statements before me I have now the honor to enclose Mr Coppock's statement and will forward any others by the next post I am inclined to think these blacks are some of those who were concerned in the attack upon Mr Faithful's party and they have for some time past been very troublesome in the country about Mr Goldwyn's station they disappear & return at unexpected periods I beg to add I have made no comment in the transaction further than I should wait instructions from Sydney It will be seen in this instance the blacks adopted more method than they usually do and the yards in which they had put the sheep were made after the manner of the white Shepherds
