That in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine the said Charles Albert Frederick Muter returned with his said Wife to this Colony on the occasion of the contemplated marriage of his step daughter Jane Charlotte Campbell Simson and in consequence of the necessity for obtaining the sanction of the Court to her marriage with the Baron Rudolph Von Suttwitz which having been duly obtained and the marriage solemnized the said Charles Albert Frederick Muter with his said Wife and her children all returned to Germany in the last mentioned year and except ~~as~~ ^{after} ~~herein~~ before appears made his permanent abode there residing with his said Wife and family down to the date of her death in the month of September one thousand eight hundred and seventy two.

That in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy one the said Charles Albert Frederick Muter again paid a visit to this Colony leaving his Wife and family in Homburg aforesaid in order to attend to some business matters here and in or about the month of May or June following he again returned to Germany and his Wife and family ~~there until the~~ and has ever since

resided there until the date of his death.

4. That although the said Charles Albert Frederick Muter deceased died at Florence in Italy he informed me in a letter shortly before his death that he had gone there from Homburg aforesaid merely on a visit for the benefit of his health.

5. That after the death of the said Charles Albert Frederick Muter his remains were removed from Florence aforesaid and interred at Homburg aforesaid and under the circumstances and for the reasons above appearing I am enabled to state that the said Charles Albert Frederick Muter was a German native and was domiciled in Germany at the time of his death.
