 - 一凡有洋船搭載唐人要預先七日稟官報明所往之地方並開行日期船中要醫生一名傳話一名候該官員驗察視其各能勝任者然後給照
 - 一凡該船既經稟報須任該督理官員時到船上稽查船身桅檣繩索家伙什物火食等件倘有阻攔及不遵查閱者按例每次罰銀一百磅
 - 一督理適他國搭客船隻官凡查閱船隻是否遵行後開各款方可給照
 - 一須驗明其船堅固船戶水手人數足用桅檣繩索堅妥船艙通氣船中所貯之貨總勿以潮壞薰蒸或逾額滿塞或堆放雜錯種種不妥皆於人客有礙
 - 一船中二層櫃面搭客十二歲以上者每人至少有位高六尺長六尺闊二尺共方停七十二尺為式一歲至十二歲之幼孩兩名以一名計
 - 一船面每客要留地五尺待用
 - 一火食柴水一俱要佳品安置妥當按行船日數照依後列款式辦足待用
