A Fiendish Crime.

The crime for which the youth James Williams was yesterday sentenced to death is of such appalling savagery that it challenges, and almost defeats, human power of realisation. Indeed, its very incredibility is the feature which Mr Field Barrett, who defended the prisoner, used as a basis of his appeal for mercy, for even to the resourceful barrister there was no possibility of substantial defence. The hard, horrible facts stood out grim and clear, and there was no room for doubt on any important point. The hideous young ruffian admitted the crime, after his first faint and futile attempt to dissociate himself from it, and, as Mr Justice a'Beckett remarked before passing sentence, no word of contrition appears to have passed his lips. The jury's task was easy. It was left in no doubt as to the perpetrator, nor was there the smallest reason to suppose that Williams was not, at the time of the atrocious butchery, a fully responsible person. Mr Barrett could only beg for a recommendation to mercy, on the ground that the doer of an act so atrocious could not be in the full possession of his faculties, but, as the judge pointed out, an "outburst of homicidal rage" was not what the law recognises as insanity. If that outburst had led to the striking of a single blow, or even two or three blows, followed by an agony of remorse at their fatal consequences, the case would still be one of murder. But there were no fewer than twelve awful wounds in the body of the estimable lady who fell under her assassin's cruel and relentless hand, and concerning the awful wound in whose neck he was able to coolly remark, as Constable Proudfoot examined it, "What a hell of a gash!" James Williams is a positively insoluble social puzzle. The product of ages of civilisation and the son of decent parents, he is still a mere savage. Indeed, in these times it would not be easy to discover a savage so utterly heartless and callous. To what his condition is due we do not pretend to be able to say with any certainty, but one is led to suspect that the chief cause may be found in a complete absence of mental discipline, or any kind of moral restraint. To say, however, that his case affords any public lesson would be an insult even to the criminal classes. Williams is a mere beast, and unfit for the society of men. The pity of it is that this was not found out before he was able to give his murderous hand its fatal fling.

THE CLIFTON HILL MURDER.

JAMES WILLIAMS EXECUTED.

James Williams, sentenced to death for the murder of Mrs. Mary Amelia Veitch, at Clifton Hill, on July 19, was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol yesterday morning at 10 o'clock. The execution was witnessed by officers of the gaol and the penal department, and by representatives of the press. Death was instantaneous.

When asked, on the scaffold, whether he had anything to say, the condemned man, speaking slowly and mechanically, said:—"I am very sorry for the deed that I have done." After a pause, he added, "Very, very sorry," his voice dropping to a murmur. After the rope had been tightened he said, almost under his breath, "God forgive me."

The condemned man had just completed his twentieth year.

A WRITTEN CONFESSION.

On Wednesday Williams asked for writing materials, and wrote out a statement, which he handed to the Rev. C. P. Bardin, gaol chaplain. Yesterday morning the paper was forwarded to the Chief Secretary (Sir Samuel Gillot). It was as follows:—

September 7, 1904,

Melbourne Gaol.

"I, James Coleman Augustus Williams, who is now about to suffer the extreme penalty of the law, do hereby make the following confession, and I trust will clear away any doubts which might be on the public mind, that I, in a fit of passion, did commit the horrible deed, for which I am very sorry; and that it was not for gain, or lust, or any malice which I had against her, for she was always kind and good to me. And I trust that the public will not look down upon my family and friends for the deed which I have [sic]. Trusting that God will forgive me for all that I have done.

"I also thank the governor, the Reverend Mr. Bardin, and the Reverend Mr. Fethers, and the officials, for their kindness to me.

"My last wish is that this should be made public through the press."

The document was not signed.

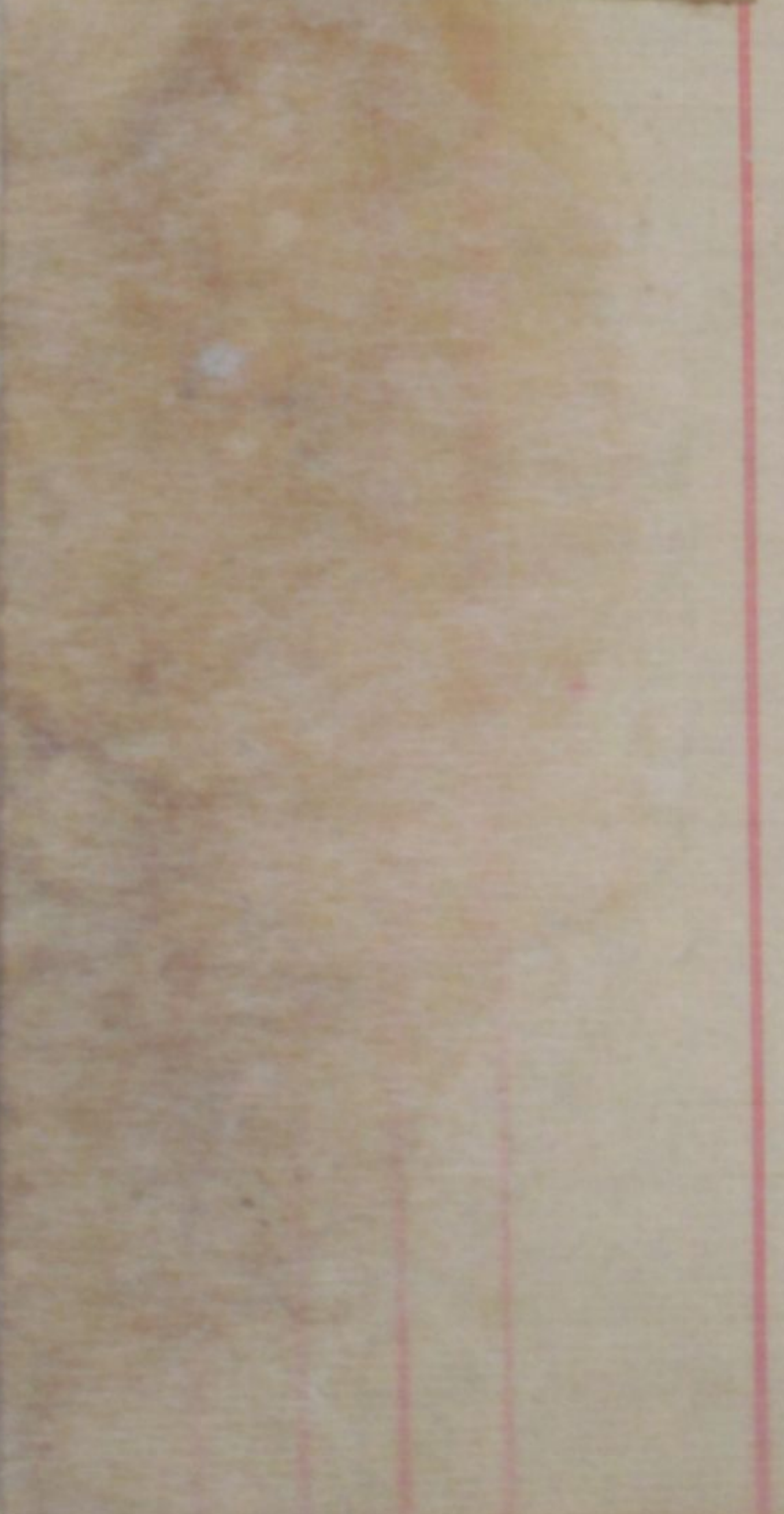
