I, Eric Magnus Meyer of Sandhurst in the Colony of Victoria, Proprietor of the Sandhurst Hotel, make oath and say First—That William Gillman late of Sandhurst in the Colony of Victoria aforesaid was at the time of his decease and his Estate still is justly and truly indebted to me in the sum of Thirty three pounds eleven shillings and six pence for Board and Lodging and feeding and Stabling of his horses at my Hotel for a period of ten weeks previous to his decease according to the particulars marked A.

Second—That the prices charged are fair and reasonable.

Third—That on the Twenty fourth day of September last I accepted a Bill of Exchange as an accommodation for the said William Gillman for the sum of thirty pounds payable two months after the date thereof which acceptance the said William Gillman indorsed to the Colonial Bank of Australasia at Sandhurst and which acceptance having fallen due previous to the decease of the said William Gillman was not paid by him and I was obliged after his decease to settle with said Bank.

Fourth—That I received no consideration whatever for said acceptance same being a mere accommodation for the said William Gillman.

Fifth—That the annexed particular marked B is a true copy of said acceptance.

Sixth—That a person named John Smith being indebted to me over a sum of Twenty Three pounds and fifteen shillings for board and Lodging and the said William Gillman being indebted to the said John Smith in the sum of Twenty three pounds

and fifteen shillings for services rendered in driving the Mail conveyance to Heathcote for the said William Gillman and for which the said William Gillman was contractor the said John Smith gave verbal directions to the said William Gillman in his life time to pay me said sum of Twenty three pounds and fifteen shillings and the said William Gillman repeatedly promised to pay me the same but died suddenly without having paid same and that subsequent to the death of the said William Gillman I received a written authority from the said John Smith a copy of which marked C is hereto annexed to receive said amount out of the assets of the said William Gillman and that said sum is still due to me.

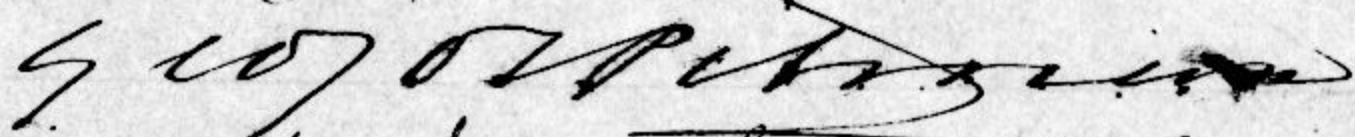
Seventh—That the said William Gillman departed this life on or about the tenth of October last intestate leaving assets to about an amount of One hundred pounds which sum is as I am informed and believe in the hands of the Curator of Intestate Estates and who refuses to pay same without an administration being taken out to said intestate.

Eighth—That the several sums now due to me as aforesaid amount to the sum of Eighty seven pounds six shillings and six pence.

Ninth—That I have not nor has any person by my order or to my knowledge for my use received the said sum of Eighty seven pounds six shillings and six pence or any part thereof or any security or satisfaction for the same or any part thereof.
