1. That on the expiration of three months after the first sale of Township lands at Sandhurst, no person will be permitted to keep a store or expose goods for sale within the Township boundary except on land

alienated from the Crown.

2. That as soon as the Survey is completed, and the allotments laid out, a large number of those on which no buildings have been erected will be first put up to Auction at the usual upset price of £ per Acre, and a month or six weeks subsequent to the first sale those allotments on which permanent buildings are erected will then be put up to Auction. The prices realized at the first sale will be used as a guide for fixing the upset price of those allotments, and to that will be added the valuation of the permanent buildings erected on them. Such valuation to be fixed by two persons, one nominated by the Owner of the Building and the other by the Crown, with power in case of difference of opinion to call in an arbitrator.

3. It is usual for purchasers of allotments to have conveyed immediate possession on their purchase, but every care should be taken by the purchaser in paying up, prior to the lapse of the month, the balance of the purchase money, as a neglect of this entails a forfeiture of the purchase.

4. That with regard to the last question, I am unable to give a final answer, but I have every reason to believe that the land opposite the Camp at Sandhurst will be included within the Township boundary and some portion of it to be subject to sale.

I would take this opportunity of expressing my regret that circumstances have delayed the sale of these lands at an earlier period, but as the speedy settlement of this locality is a matter of some moment not only to individuals but to the General Public, instructions are now to be issued that on the alignment of the Streets, and until a sale is advertised, intending purchasers

of allotments will with the sanction of the President Commissioners be permitted to commence at once their building operations on an allotment, such an allotment having been first pointed out by a Surveyor.
