hibition of all traffic in the supply of arms, explosives and other munitions of war to the natives. The French Government has adopted this course, and issued a decree accordingly, a copy of which has reached the Premier of Victoria through the usual diplomatic channels. An offender against this regulation will be liable to a fine of from 50 to 100 £, or one to five days' imprisonment. For a second offence the culprit may be imprisoned "without the option," and for an indefinite period.

The annual matches of the Victorian Rifle Association will be held this week, at Williamstown, beginning on Wednesday with the first stage of the Queen's, the Ladies' Nomination and the Medium matches. On Thursday the second stage of the Queen's will be fired, and then the Freeman and the Clubs' match. The Sargood Long Range match is the first business for Thursday, and the final for the Queen's takes place in the afternoon, followed by the Brassey Judging Distance match. On Saturday the events will be the United Service, Junior, Representative and Senior Cadet matches. The official programme, and scoring book has now been issued to competitors.

As there is a considerable trade in tallow between Australia and Chili, exporters will be interested in a despatch just received by the Premier from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, announcing an important change in the Chilean customs tariff. The British representative at Santiago, Mr. J. G. Kennedy, wrote on 23rd October last drawing attention to a proposed increase of the duty on fat from 25 per cent. ad valorem to 60 per cent. The alteration had still to be ratified by the Senate, but it was not likely to be materially modified. In view of the similarity between fat and tallow, Mr. Kennedy suggests that Australian exporters of tallow should take precautions to avoid disputes with the Chilean customs officials by placing themselves in a position to prove that their product is tallow, and not fat, and is consequently admissible at the lower duty.

On the occasion of the visit of his Excellency the Governor to the aboriginal settlement at Coranderrk, on 25th October last, he was requested by an old lady (Mrs. Ronan) to forward to the Queen a basket made of grass. His Excellency commissioned his brother, Mr. Albert Brassey, to take charge of the basket, and on his arrival in England to request Sir Arthur Bigge, her Majesty's private secretary, to place Mrs. Ronan's gift before the Queen. The Governor received a letter from Sir Arthur Bigge by last mail informing him that her Majesty was much interested in the gift, and begged his Excellency to convey her thanks to Mrs. Ronan.

THE GEAKE FRAUDS.

A NICE LAW POINT.

An interesting law point, which is worrying the mind of both the Premier and the Attorney-General, has been raised by James Edward Geake, the Daylesford solicitor, who is undergoing a term of imprisonment for defrauding a client. Geake was tried in the first instance for another offence of a similar character, and sentenced to two years' imprisonment, but he was allowed out on bail pending an appeal to the Full Court on a point raised during the trial. Before, however, the Court gave its decision, Geake absconded to South America. As there were grave doubts as to whether Geake could be extradited from South America for the offence, a second charge of defrauding a client was preferred against him, and a warrant issued for his arrest. On this warrant he was extradited from Monte Video, and sentenced to 18 months' imprisonment, which he is now serving. The point raised by him is that, having been handed over by the South American authorities to be tried for this offence only, he will be a free man when the sentence of 18 months is completed, notwithstanding that there is a sentence of two years recorded against him for the first offence, which is still unserved. His contention is that as regards this sentence and all other charges he is still an absconder, and is technically in South America.
