Aug: 26th Has been much better, and doing a little needlework, and taking exercise in the airing yard.

Sept 1st Had a number of epileptic seizures lasting for more than two hours, very severe. Nitrate of Amyle seemed to aggravate the fits, after an oil & turpentine enemata got better.

Sept 3rd Became violent last night, and refused to go to bed or allow anyone to undress her, on my being called she became quiet, undressed and went to bed, taking her medicine Chloral and Pot. Brom. Slept till 10th but remained quietly in bed afterwards, quiet this morning.

Sept 30th Requires constant attention, has not had an epileptic attack since the 1st, is occasionally violent.

12 July 97. Is occasionally violent after the epileptic fits.

17. 9. 90. Is in good bodily health; had a succession of epileptic fits which were very severe in character. Mental state greatly enfeebled.

20. 9. 90. Has been maniacal for last few days, noisy excited, gesticulating, violent, rushing about yard during day; & hammering at door & shouting during night; after daylight remained quiet during greater part of the night.

22. 9. 90. Has had no fits for last few days & is now fairly quiet & manageable.
