on his oath saith as follows:

I was called to see
Deceased on Sunday morning
last - and found him recently dead

I have made a post mortem
examination of the body of Deceased
externally there are no marks of violence
there is no indication of pressure
having been applied to the nose mouth
neck or chest - Internally I found
the Brain and its membranes greatly
engorged - with dark blood

I found a large quantity of bloody
serum within the Skull. I found a
much more than the usual quantity of serum
in the Ventricles of the Brain

I found the lungs congested - the ~~arteries~~
pages - were free from obstruction - the heart
was healthy but contained dark
fluid blood in the right cavities
I examined the Trachea there was
no frothy mucus in its lining membrane
which was not congested

The stomach contained about
an ounce of a half of natural
food. It was quite healthy
all the other organs of the body were
healthy - The chest was of good
average size - and appeared well
nurtured

The cause of death was effusion
of fluid at the base of the
Brain I had called to see Decem
at about 8 pm of 20th. Geo. Robt. Rieley
