I have to report that on the 2" inst at about 5 p.m. a boy named Frank Mallard, age 15 years (whose parents reside at 6 helwynol St- ht melbourne) was killed during the storm which took Glace at Bughton Beach. Tinterviewed James Sear of 14 Chamber St. South Thura who informed me that he is a Conductor on the Bughlon Electric hams and was on duty at The Beach terminus at about 5 pm on the 2 minst. after the storm passed he noticed the boy laying on the road, in front of the Baths. his head was badly smashed and portion of the brains were laying close by Sear and another man removed the body to the Baths.
