Melbourne aforesaid Laborer do jointly and severally make oath
and say

1. That we are seeking to obtain Probate of the Will of the
abovenamed Josiah Bragg deceased.
2. That the said deceased died on the Fifth day of September
one thousand eight hundred and eighty one leaving his last Will
and Testament bearing date the Twelfth day of May One thousand
eight hundred and eighty which is as we believe unrevoked and
thereby appointed us these deponents executrix and executor thereof.
3. That the paper writing hereunto annexed marked A is the
true last Will and Testament of the said deceased as we verily
believe.
4. That the said Will was executed in the presence of
Louis G. Wilkinson of Melbourne aforesaid Auctioneer and
Edward West Hubbard of the same place Clerk to the said
Louis G. Wilkinson.
5. That the said deceased left real estate in the Colony of
Victoria of the value of One thousand five hundred and fifty Pounds
and personal property in the said Colony of the value of
Four hundred and fifty Pounds.
6. That if we obtain Probate we will well and truly collect
and administer according to law to the best of our knowledge and

ability the property lands and hereditaments goods chattels
and credits of the said deceased at the time of his death which
at any time after shall come to the power or control hands or
possession of us as his executors or of any other person or
persons for us; that we will make or cause to be made a true
and perfect inventory of all and singular the property
lands and hereditaments goods chattels and credits of the
said deceased which shall have come to the hands possession
or knowledge of us or to the hands or possession of any other
other person or persons for us and the same so made will
sign with our proper handwriting and will exhibit and
deposit or cause to be exhibited and deposited the same Inventory
in the Office of the Master in Equity within three calendar
months next ensuing the order granting Probate; and further
that we will make or cause to be made a true and just
account of the administration of the estate which we have
undertaken as to our receipts and disbursements and as to
what portion is retained by us and what portion remains
uncollected and the same so made will sign with our
proper handwriting and will exhibit and deposit or cause
to be exhibited and deposited the same account in the said
office of the Master in Equity within fifteen calendar months
next ensuing the order granting Probate.

Testament of me Josiah Cragg

of Little Lonsdale Street in the City of
Melbourne and Colony of Victoria
Licensed Victualler After payment of
all my just debts funeral and testamentary
expenses I give devise and bequeath unto
My eldest Son Josiah Cragg all my
Carpenters tools and Carpenters effects To
my second son Thomas Cragg all my
wearing apparel Watch and Chain To my
daughter Mary Jane Cragg The four
Dick Cottages called and named Ennis
Terrace situate in Park Street West
Melbourne And to my wife Bridget
Cragg those buildings known as York
House and Quinn Cottage situate in
Park Street aforesaid together with the
good will of the Hotel known as the Royal
Mint Hotel situate in Little Lonsdale
Street aforesaid together with the Trade
Fixtures Stock &c appertaining thereto
and I further bequeath to my said
wife all Shares which I may be
possessed of at the time of my decease
and I appoint her my residuary
legatee

And I hereby Appoint Charles
Ingberg of Park Street Melbourne aforesaid
Laborer and my said wife Executors of
this my Will at the same time revoking

all former and other wills and codicils of
wills In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand this twelfth day of May
in the year of our Lord One thousand eight
hundred and eighty
