



I WALTER BRYANT HOUSE of Number 22 William Street, Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, Curator of the Estates of Deceased Persons, make oath and say -

1. THAT on the twelfth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five I obtained from this Honorable Court a Rule to Administer the Estate of John Pinsent late a passenger on the Steamship "Hobsons Bay" and formerly of Minehead, Somerset, England, clergyman, deceased, who died intestate on the twentyfourth day of April One thousand nine hundred and twentyfive.

2. THAT the estate of the said John Pinsent deceased consisted of - - money in a bank, money payable under a life assurance policy, motor cycle and personal effects and after payment of administration expenses and - - claims of creditors there remained an amount of about Nine hundred and Seventy pounds for distribution.

3. THAT the only relatives and next of kin of the said deceased are his widow Edith Mary Pinsent and his two infant children John Pinsent aged three years and Mary Catherine Pinsent aged one year and five months -- residing with their mother at Number 432 Nicholson Street, North Fitzroy, in the said State and the share of the estate to which each of the said children is entitled is about Three hundred pounds, portion of which amount will be invested in Victorian Government Inscribed Stock.

4. THAT I believe the said Edith Mary Pinsent is unable to maintain the said children unless some allowance be made to her for that purpose from the share of the estate to which the said children are entitled and I know of no relative or any other person who is willing to do so free of charge.

5. THAT I consider it in the best interest of the said children that this Honorable Court authorise me to deduct from the capital of the share

together with the income of such share from time to time make up -
an amount equal to Ten shillings per week for each of the said - -
children and to apply such sum towards the clothing maintenance
