I am an attendant in the James Bond Lunatic Asylum. The deceased Paddy Doyle was under my charge at the time of his death and from the 6th of July last. He was in Hospital. He was then feeble and paralyzed. He was able to get about until the 15th of this month when he became bedridden until the 25th instant when he died. He was seen regularly twice a day by Dr. Dick. The Official Visitors saw him on their visits. Dr. Paly also saw him. He had several persons called to see him. He had medical diet with stimulants. The bed room began to fume about two days before his death.

THE Deponent
 on his oath, saith as follows:—

Frederick James West Ford

I am a legally qualified
 Surgeon living in Melbourne. I have
 made a post mortem Examination of
 the deceased Paddy Doyle. Externally
 The body was much emaciated - there were
 no marks of violence - there was a small bed sore
 on the Sacrum - The feet appeared to have commenced
 to be gangrenous - Internally the Membranes of the
 brain were excessively congested and adherent. The
 brain was much congested - suffused with serum
 and the ventricles distended with fluid - The substance
 of the brain was softened - The lungs were healthy
 in structure but collapsed & devoid of blood -
 The liver was healthy. The right side filled with
 a clot of fibrin - the liver was excessively congested
 - The Stomach contained a small quantity of fluid -
 The Intestines were empty - The Mesenteric Glands
 diseased - The Cause of death was
 Chronic disease of the brain and Extension
