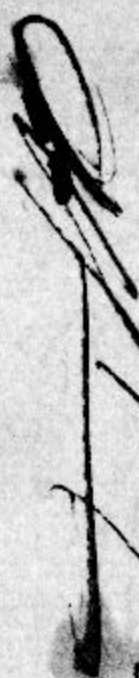

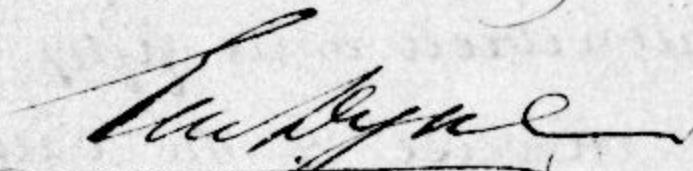

2. That she left one Daughter namely Leonora St Anders Vile who is of the age of nineteen years and two sons namely George Fernandez Smyth who is of the age of sixteen years and Peregrine Fernandez Smyth who is the age of fourteen years the only next of kin her surviving
3. That they are the only persons entitled to a distribution of her property
4. That the said Lucy Knight Smyth had at the time of her death property in the said Colony not exceeding in value seven hundred and fifty pounds
5. That before the decease of the said Lucy Knight Smyth her Daughter aforesaid in the month of July One thousand eight hundred and sixty one became and was married to me and from that time and until the decease of the said Lucy Knight Smyth she resided with her said Daughter and myself
