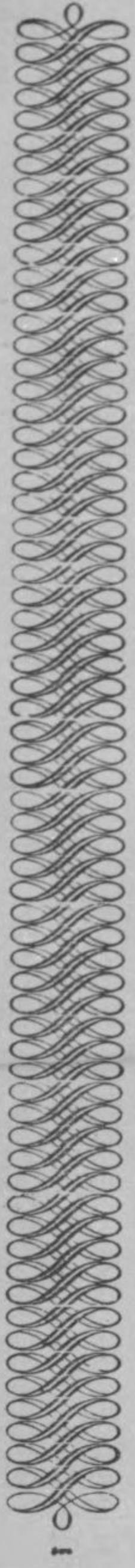

On the 30th of October 1914 at Wellington I made a post mortem of the body of a man.
The body was that of an old Chinaman.
There were no marks.
The heart was large, dilated, the valvular orifices enlarged, the aorta showed slight atheroma.

The lungs were congested in upper lobes
suppurating, the lower lobes were collapsed.
The brain was healthy and firm.

The spleen was small and firm.

The kidneys were tough.

The brain was healthy, vessels atheromatous.

The windpipe was haemorrhagic.

Death was due to dilatation of the heart and
oedema of the lungs.
