On the 24th day of January, 1915 at the Sunbury
Hospital for the Insane I made a postmortem exam: of
the body of a woman named - I was informed Mary
Louisa Follett aged 53 years. My findings were as follows
externally. Body emaciated - no marks.

Heart. nothing abnormal weight 10 g.

Left lung adherent firmly to chest & irre movable collapsed & sticky
and with disseminated tubercles throughout

R. Lung 31 g. white organ an aggregation of tubercles & granules
& consolidated.

Liver 49 g. healthy. Spleen 60 g. soft & pulpy

Kidneys R. 45. L. 42 g. fairly healthy.

Intestines congested. Mesenteric glands enlarged
Calvarium thick. Dura thickened - Membranes opaque

Brain 43 g. no marked app. changes
