1. I am seeking to obtain Probate of the Will of the above named Robert Stainsby deceased.
2. The said deceased died on the Ninth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty seven.
3. The said deceased made his last Will and Testament bearing date the Seventh day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty seven which is as I believe unrevoked and thereby appointed me this deponent, James Stainsby, Executor thereof.
4. The said Will is herewith annexed.
5. The said deceased had at the time of his death real estate in the Colony of Victoria of the value of Two hundred and fifty six pounds and personal Estate in the said Colony of the value of Twenty two pounds and together not exceeding the amount in value of Two hundred and seventy eight pounds.
6. Henry Speed of Geelong in the Colony of Victoria, an Attorney of the Supreme Court of the said Colony and James Matthews of Geelong aforesaid Boot Maker are the subscribing Witnesses to the said Will.
7. If I obtain Probate I will well and truly collect and administer according to law, to the best of my knowledge and ability, the property, lands, and hereditaments, goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased at the time of his death, which at any time after shall come to the power or control, hands, or possession of me as his Executor or of any other person or persons for me; that I will

make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the property, lands, and hereditaments, goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased which shall have come to the hands, possession or knowledge of me, or to the hands or possession of any other person or persons for me, and the same so made will sign with my proper handwriting, and will exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited, the same inventory in the Office of the Master in Equity within three calendar months next ensuing the order granting Probate; and, further, that I will make or cause to be made a true and just account of the administration of the Estate which I have undertaken as to my receipts and disbursements, and as to what portion is retained by me and what portion remains uncollected, and the same so made will sign with my proper handwriting, and will exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited, the same account in the said Office of the Master in Equity within fifteen calendar months next ensuing the order granting Probate.

8. I will pay all the debts and legacies of the said deceased so far as the property left by him will extend and the law bind me so to do.
