administer according to law to the best of their  
knowledge and ability the property lands and  
hereditaments goods chattels and credits of the said  
deceased at the time of his death which at any  
time after shall come to the power or control hands  
or possession of them the said Christian Henry  
James Walker and Henry Curwen Walker as his  
Executors or of any other person or persons for them

and that they will make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the property lands and hereditaments goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which shall have come to the hands possession or knowledge of them the said Christian Henry James Walker and Henry Curwen Walker or to the hands or possession of any other person or persons for them and the same so made will sign with their proper handwriting and that they will exhibit and deposit or cause to be exhibited and deposited the same inventory in the office of the Master in Equity within three calendar months next ensuing the Order granting Probate and further that they will make or cause to be made a true and perfect account of the administration of the estate which they have undertaken as to their receipts and disbursements and as to what portion is retained by them and what portion remains uncollected and the same so made will sign with their respective proper handwriting and will exhibit and deposit or cause to be exhibited and deposited the same account in the said office of the Master in Equity within fifteen calendar months next ensuing the Order granting Probate and that the said deceased had at the time of his death property within the said Colony not exceeding the value of Four thousand pounds


