order granting Probate, and further that she would make or cause to be made a true and just account of the administration of the Estate which she had undertaken as to her receipts and disbursements, and as to what portion was retained by her and what portion remained uncollected, and the same so made would sign with her proper handwriting, and would exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited, the same account in the said office of the Master in Equity within fifteen calendar months next ensuing, the order granting Probate, and that she believed the lands, goods, chattels, credits and effects of the said *George William Walker* deceased, did not exceed in value *Forty three pounds Eighteen Shillings*
