Brake; German Consul in trust for M^{rs} Karveran widow of the late M^r Waldemar Karveran the sum of Twenty five Pounds, to Henry Charles Herbert, Auctioneer, Ballarat, the sum of Fifty Pounds Sterling, and the balance of all I possess consisting of Cash in Banks, Life Insurance, proceeds of personal property, to be forwarded through the German Consul to my nephew Julius Bauer of Frankfurt a/M, or to my niece Maria wife of Jacob Jeger of Schanffhausen Tetzgerland to be by her or her estate may be, distributed among my other nephews, or nieces as instructed by me in letters to them and the sending the money to the German Consul for that purpose to release my executors from any further liability.
