- 1 That being possessed of five shares in
the Capital stock of a certain Joint
Stock Company carrying on business
in the Colony of Victoria under the
name form or style of the Victoria
Insurance Company I did on the
day of August in the year
of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and fifty three transfer the said shares
in the books of the said Company into
the name of the above named Emanuel
Charles Greene now deceased in trust for the
sole use and benefit of his daughter
Charlotte Malvina Greene an Infant
then of the age of seventeen years and
I handed to him the scrip issued
by the said Company in respect of
said shares

2. That the said Emmanuel Charles Greene accepted the said trust and acted therein but the particulars thereof were never committed to writing nor was any evidence or memorandum thereof entered in the books of the said Company

3. That on the twelfth day of January in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven the said E.C. Emmanuel Charles Greene deposited with the said scrip with William Nicholson and Andrew Sutherland both of the City of Melbourne in the Colony of Victoria Merchants carrying on business in Melbourne aforesaid under the name style or firm of William Nicholson and Company as security for the payment of fifty six pounds due from him to them together with interest and at the same time transferred the said shares in the books of the said Insurance Company into the names of the said William Nicholson and Andrew Sutherland

4. That the said Emmanuel Charles Greene departed this life on or about the fourth day of November one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven without having made a will leaving Charlotte Greene his widow him surviving

5 That after the decease of the said Emanuel Charles Greene the said William Christolson and Andrew Sutherland sold the said shares and received therefor the sum of One hundred and sixty two pounds ten shillings

6 That after retaining the sum of Forty four pounds, seventeen shillings and one penny being the balance due to them by the said Emanuel Charles Greene deceased there remains in the hands of the said William Christolson and Andrew Sutherland the sum of One hundred and forty seven pounds twelve shillings and eleven pence which they are willing to pay over to any person legally authorized to receive same

v. l. c. 7 That on the twentieth day of September in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six the said Charlotte Malvina Greene intermarried with Stephen Lintoll of Limerick Lower Murray in the Colony of New South Wales. Castle Sturt who thereby became entitled to the said sum of One hundred and forty seven pounds twelve shillings and eleven pence

8 That the said Emanuel Charles Greene at the time of his decease was possessed of neither goods
