Gentleman make oath and say—

1. That *I am* seeking to obtain Probate of the Will of the above named *Andrew Lanneu* deceased.
2. The said deceased died on the *First* day of *September*
One thousand eight hundred and *ninety-three* at *Ararat in*
the Colony of Victoria
3. The said deceased left a Will bearing date the *fourteenth* day of
May One thousand eight hundred and *ninety-two* which is as I verily
believe the last Will and Testament of the said deceased and which is unrevoked as I verily believe
4. By his said Will the testator appointed me *James Russell* of
Ararat aforesaid in the Colony aforesaid, Gentleman sole
executor thereof.
5. The paper-writing hereunto annexed marked "A" is the ^{said} true last Will and
Testament of the said deceased as I verily believe.
6. The said Will was executed in the presence of *Theodore George Grant*
Barrister at Law and *James Hogan, Attendant, both of*
Ararat in the Colony of Victoria
7. The said deceased left real estate in the Colony of Victoria not exceeding ~~the~~ in
value of *the sum of One thousand two hundred pounds*
and personal property in the said Colony not exceeding ⁱⁿ the value of *the sum of Five hundred*
and Sixty four pounds ten Shillings making together the sum of One thousand
Eleven hundred and Sixty four pounds ten Shillings
8. That to the best of my knowledge, information and belief, the said deceased did
not within the space of two years preceding the date of his death convey or otherwise
dispose of, for other than adequate valuable consideration any real or personal property of
which he was seized or possessed.

9. That if I obtain Probate I will well and truly collect and administer according to law to the best of *my* knowledge and ability the property, lands, and hereditaments, goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased at the time of *his* death which at any time after shall come to the power or control, hands or possession of *me* as *his* executor or of any other person or persons for *me* that I will make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the property, lands and hereditaments, goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which shall have come to the hands, possession or knowledge of *me* or to the hands or possession of any other person or persons for *me* and the same so made will sign with *my* proper hand-writing and will exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited the same inventory in the office of the Master-in-Equity within three calendar months next ensuing the order granting Probate and further that I will make or cause to be made a true and just account of the administration of the estate which I have undertaken as to *my* receipts and disbursements, and as to what portion is retained by *me* and what portion remains uncollected and the same so made will sign with *my* proper hand writing, and will exhibit and deposit, or cause to be exhibited and deposited, the same account in the said office of the Master-in-Equity within fifteen calendar months next ensuing the order granting probate.

RH 10 That the said deceased was not at the time of his death possessed of or entitled to any real or personal property outside the Colony of Victoria

This is the Last Will and Testament of me
Andrew Lannen of Barkly Street Ararat in the
Colony of Victoria. Licensed Victualler.

I direct all my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses
Probate duty (if any) and costs of proving this my Will to be first
paid out of my estate and thereafter I give devise and
bequeath to my children, John, James, Terence, Mary Jane,
and Maggie in equal portions share and share alike whatever
money there may be in hand or to my credit in bank or
current account or upon deposit together with all interest accruing
or accrued thereon. I also give devise and bequeath unto my
said children in equal portions share and share alike all other
the real and personal estate of which I may be seized or possessed
at the time of my death consisting at the date hereof of the allotment
of land and property known as the Court House Hotel situated in Barkly
Street Ararat. my business as the licensee thereof, the license thereto belonging
the stock in trade, my household furniture and other personal effects
and debts due to me. I direct that if my children cannot arrange a
distribution of my said property between themselves satisfactory to each
and every one of them, the same shall be sold in such way as to my
Executor shall seem best and the proceeds divided equally between
my said children.

I appoint James Russell of Ararat. Gentleman
Executor of this my Will which I declare to be my true Last
Will and Testament.
