This is the last Will and Testament of me Maria Robertson of Gladly South Australia Widow I give and bequeath unto my nephew George Robertson of South Melbourne the legacy or sum of One hundred pounds And I give devise and bequeath all the residue and remainder of my real and personal estate and effects whatsoever and wheresoever unto my son William Robertson of Adelaide South Australia Medical Practitioner and my daughter Maria wife of Dr. Magarey of the same place To hold the same residuary real and personal estate unto my said son and daughter in trust as to one moiety thereof for my said daughter Maria for her separate use but in case of her death in my lifetime then in trust for her children living at my decease equally if more than one and if only one then for such one only And as to the other moiety of such residuary real and personal estate in trust for my son the said William Robertson but in case of his death in my lifetime leaving children or a child then in trust as to such last mentioned moiety for such children equally if more than one and if only one then for such one only But if my said son William should die in my lifetime without leaving children or a child then in trust as to the income of such moiety for the widow (if any) of my said son for life and after her decease or if no such widow then in trust as to the whole of such last mentioned moiety and the accruing income thereof

for my said daughter Maria absolutely for her separate use I Appoint my said son William Robertson and my said daughter Maria Magarey Executors and Trustees of this my Will In witness whereof I have to this my Will set my hand this seventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety eight
