NH I have to report that Maximilian Michael Gabriel Simonson 69 years of age a patient in St Helens licensed mental Hospital Wood St Preston died suddenly at 10³⁰ am 30.9.20

Mr Mabel Baillie medical Superintendent of the institution stated that deceased was admitted on the 30th December 1915 suffering from Locomotor Ataxia, during the last 3 weeks he had steadily grown weaker, his heart being affected and his feet swelling, he developed Broncho-pneumonia and died suddenly as stated above.

I examined the body but could find no marks of violence.

There appears to be no suspicious circumstances connected with the death.

 under the arrangements provided for
 Inpatient from a servant to Cecilia
 with delusions. He remained
 much in the same condition until
 three weeks ago, when he showed
 signs of general break up.
 He gradually grew worse - his
 heart became very weak
 he died on September 30th
 at 10.30 am.

His relatives had seen him three weeks before his death and
 that had been informed of his condition every day and he was seen
 by the Inspector-General a day or two before his death.

I made a post mortem examination of the boy identified as
Maximilian Michaelis Gabriel Simonson

The boy was that of a small male with a septal abscess
in the scap and osseous of the lower extremities

The heart was hypertrophied and the wall of the aorta
atheromatous. The liver was normal in character.

The kidneys showed suppurative nephritis. The lungs
were rather collapsed and a double Hydropneumothorax was present

The brain was that of quaternary syphilis with arterio-
pathic changes

The cause of death was Heart Disease Suppurative
nephritis and double Hydropneumothorax
