I am a Surgeon
I have made a post mortem
examination of the body of the deceased
externally I found no marks of
violence - Internally I found
a considerable quantity of blood
effused under the scalp
at the posterior part of the left
parietal bone. I found the skull
fractured - to the extent of three
inches - I found blood effused on
the surface of the dura mater at
the site of the fracture - I found blood
also on the surface of the brain
and also in its substance. The brain
was also lacerated I found
also an effusion of blood in

The anterior lobes of the brain.

The brain and its membranes
were cystic - all the organs of
the body were healthy - except the liver
which was fatty - and the left
kidney which was completely wasted
away - the right one was greatly
enlarged. The Pineal Gland was
the Yachin of the skull
described.
