same so made will sign with my proper handwriting and will exhibit and deposit or cause to be exhibited and deposited the same Inventory in the Office of the Master in Equity within three calendar months next ensuing the order granting Probate and further

✓ CW That I will make or cause to be made a true and just account of the administration of the Estate which I have undertaken as to my receipts and disbursements and as to what portion is retained ^{by me} and what portion remains uncollected and the same so made will sign with my proper handwriting and will exhibit and deposit or cause to be exhibited and deposited the same account in the ^{said} office of the Master in Equity within fifteen calendar months next ensuing the Order granting Probate.

4. That I believe the said deceased at the time of his death had no real property in the Colony of Victoria and his personal property did not exceed in value ~~Seven~~ ^{Eight} Hundred and Fifty Pounds.
