In the Will of Jonathan Wragg  
late of Warrack in the Colony of  
Victoria Farmer deceased

We Henry Wragg and Thomas Purcell  
Rubie both of Warrack in the Colony of Victoria  
Farmers jointly and severally make oath and say

1<sup>st</sup> That the said Jonathan Wragg late of  
Warrack aforesaid Farmer departed this life on  
the Twenty second day of June one thousand  
eight hundred and eighty

2<sup>nd</sup> That the said Jonathan Wragg left  
a Will bearing date the first day of November  
one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine—  
which is as we believe unrevoked and thereby  
appointed us the said Henry Wragg and Thomas  
Purcell Rubie Trustees thereof

3 That the said Will was executed in the  
presence of Thomas Child and Co Child of  
Murraybush in the said Colony of Victoria, Butchers

4 That we believe the paper writing now  
produced and shown to us and marked with  
the letter A is the true last Will and Testament  
of the said Jonathan Wragg deceased

5 That the said Jonathan Wragg had  
at the time of his decease real and personal property  
in the said Colony of Victoria under the value of  
Three hundred and seventeen Pounds and that  
such real property did not exceed in value two  
hundred and eighty Pounds and that such  
personal property was under the value of Thirty

6<sup>th</sup> seven Bonds

That we are seeking to obtain Probate  
of the Will of the said Jonathan Muzz deceased

That if we obtain Probate we will well  
and truly collect and administer accordingly  
to law to the best of our knowledge and ability  
the property lands and hereditaments goods  
chattels and credits of the said deceased at the  
time of his death which at anytime after shall come  
to the power or contrall hands or possession of us  
as his Trustees or of any other person or persons  
for us That we will make or cause to be made  
a true and perfect inventory of all and singular  
the property lands and hereditaments goods chattels  
and credits of the said deceased which shall  
have come to the hands possession or knowledge  
of us or to the hands or possession of any other  
person or persons for us and the same so made  
will sign with our proper handwriting and will  
exhibit and deposit or cause to be exhibited  
and deposited the same inventory in the office  
of the Master in Equity within three calendar  
months next ensuing the order granting Probate  
And further that we will make or cause  
to be made a true and just account of the  
administration of the Estate which we have  
undertaken as to our receipts and disbursements  
and as to what portion is retained by  
us and what portion remains uncollected  
and the same so made will sign with  
our proper handwriting and will exhibit  
and deposit or cause to be exhibited  
and deposited the same account in  
the said office of the Master in Equity

within fifteen calendar months next ensuing  
the order granting Probate

Wareh Nov 1st 1869

I Jonathan Wragg of Wareh Farmer  
do make this for my last Will and  
Testament by the Grace of God Amen  
when all of my just debts are paid  
I then give and bequeath <sup>to my wife Jane Wragg</sup> all the rents  
arising from lands and Buildings and  
I give my wife the interest of all for  
her Natural life and at my wifes  
death I give and bequeath <sup>to my son Henry Wragg</sup> the Small  
Farm about seven or eight acres with  
house and out buildings <sup>on the juston Bridge</sup> situated in the  
parish of Grasford and in the Township of  
Heag and in the County of Derby and I give  
and bequeath to my son Henry all of my share  
and interest in lands situated in the Parish  
of Wareh and Bit-Bit and my share and  
interest in all Farming implements goods  
and Chattels and what ever I may die possessed  
of I give and bequeath to my aforesaid son Henry  
Wragg and I hereby appoint my son Henry and  
Thomas Rubie sole trustees of this my last  
Will and Testament
