year of our Lord One thousand eight  
hundred and fifty eight which is  
as I believe unrevoked and hereby  
appointed his wife Eliza Charlwood  
sole executrix thereof

3 That the said will was executed  
in the presence of me and one James  
Perkins of Melbourne in the said Colony Baker

4 That the said Stephen Charlwood  
had at the time of his death property  
in the Colony of Victoria aforesaid  
not exceeding in value the sum of  
one hundred and fifty pounds -
