This Deponent * Robert W. D. Clark, Notary Public,on h^{is} oath saith, I am Medical Superintendentresiding at The Hospital for the Insane Ballarat* Christian and
Surname in
full.

I find from the records of the
asylums that the deceased Charles
Jones, whose body now lies in the sarcophagus
was admitted on the authority of the
warden now deceased, on the 3rd December
1894 as a transfer from Kew Asylum,
suffering from dementia —
on the 25 November last he suffered
from Retention of urine, for which he
had to be catheterized daily till the
6th January 1895. On the 28th December
last an attack of Drunkenness came
on, which lasted till ~~the~~ the 10th
~~January~~, leaving him very weak & feeble
and from the general effects of which
he died on the 12th instant at 5.45 pm.
The apparent cause of death being
Diphtheria —
