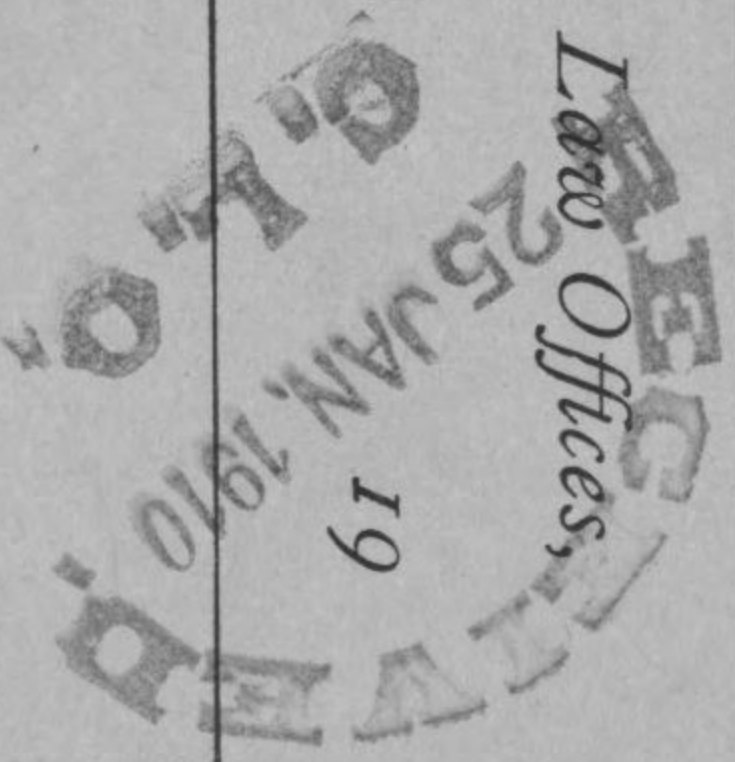

Aylmer. Alexander Macfarlane
 on his oath saith, I am a *legally qualified medical man*
 residing at *the Sunbury Asylum.*

* Christian and
 Surname in
 full.

*He deceased Harry Monaghan was admitted
 to the Sunbury Asylum on the 11th of September 1908
 on the Warrant produced suffering from Alcoholic
 Insanity.*

*On January, 16th 1910 I was called to the Receiving
 Ward about 7.45 pm to see this patient, who was
 said to have had an attack of Apoplexy.*

*On my arrival in the Ward I found the patient almost
 unconscious with complete loss of motion & sensation
 in the left arm & leg.*

*The following morning I had him transferred to the
 Hospital. He remained in bed all the time & ^{5.4 a.m.} ~~gradually~~
 gradually worse & died. Jan 21st 1910. Ape ~~asphyxiated~~
 His wife was informed of his illness but did not come
 to visit him. He was seen by the Priest.*

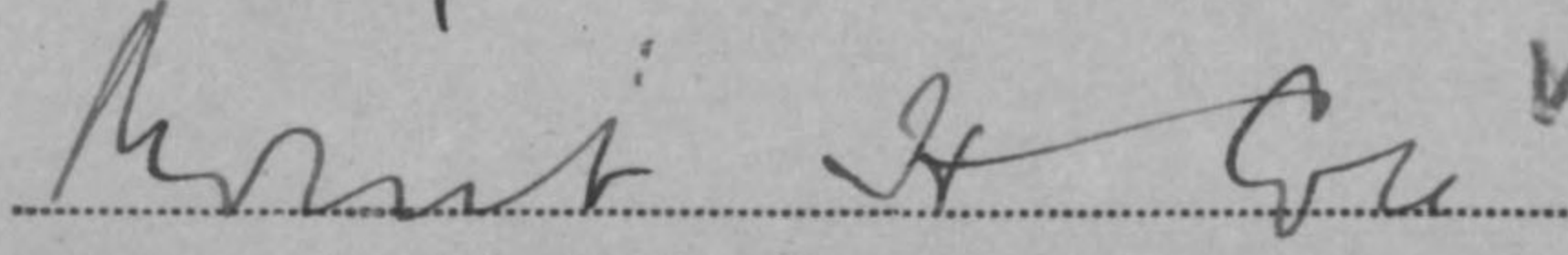

in presence of nurse Monaghan.
No friend visited him except Rev^d
Father Gibbons on 16. 1. 10 The
official visitors were through on
29. 12. 09
