The Condition of the above written Bond is such that if the above bounden John Stubbs (administrator of the goods chattels and credits of Gibson Stubbs deceased) Do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods credits and effects of the

said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of him the said John Stubbs or to the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made to exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria at or before the third day of June which will be in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty four and the same goods chattels and effects and all other the goods chattels credits and effects of the said deceased at the time of his decease or which at any time afterwards shall come to the hands or possession of the said John Stubbs or to the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him shall well and truly administer according to Law and further shall make or cause to be made a true and just account of his said administration at or before the third day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty four and afterwards from time to time as he shall be lawfully required And all the rest and residue of the said goods chattels credits and effects which shall be found from time to time remaining upon the said administration account the same being first examined and allowed of by the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria shall and do pay and dispose of in due course of administration or in such manner as the said Court shall or direct then the before written obligation to be

void and of no effect or else to be and remain
in full force and virtue.
