Michael Elliot of the City of Melbourne in the Colony
of Victoria Bank Manager and Frederick James
Fickling of Warrnambool in the said Colony

by the first Codicil dated the thirty first day of March one
thousand eight hundred and sixty five to the Will of the

Master in Equity a true and perfect Inventory of all
and singular the property lands and hereditaments
goods chattels and credits of the said deceased
within three Calendar months of the order for Probate and
a true and just account of the administration of the
Estate of the said deceased within fifteen calendar
months next of the said order pursuant to the Rules
of this Honorable Court and that they believed the Estate
of the said George Webster deceased in the said Colony
of Victoria did not exceed in value one thousand
one hundred pounds
