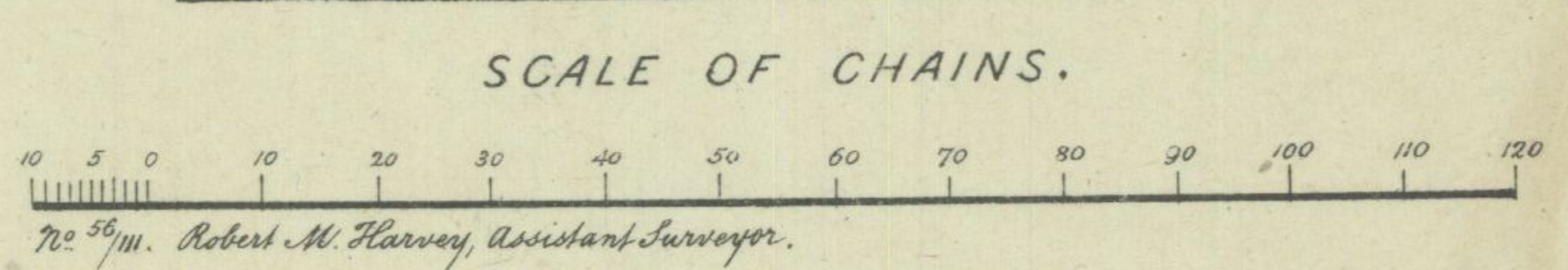


Plan of

Report.

This Survey is situated north-easterly from Ballarat, from
to 21 miles, and north-easterly from Creswick, from 4
to 13 miles.

- ALLOTMENTS.
- 1-3, 4 - Near the creek, rich black soil, the remaining portion
of poor quality and very lightly timb^d with Honey-suckle.
 - 5, 6 - Poor Clay soil and very stony, devoid of timber.
 - 7-19 inclusive. Of a very fine quality, generally, chocolate soil,
timbered with Lightwood and Gum.
 - 20 - Poor Clay soil.
 - 21-37 inclusive. Of a very rich quality, chocolate soil, and timb^d
with Lightwood and Gum. The swamps are dry in
summer, and can be easily drained into the
Boolorook creek, if required.
 - 38 - Poor soil.
 - 39, 47 - Of a very good quality, generally chocolate soil,
lightly timbered with Gum and Wattle.
 - 49 - Poor soil.
 - 69 inclusive. Of good quality generally, chocolate soil, timb^d
with Lightwood and Gum.
