1. That the above named John Benjamin Donoghue  
late of the City of Melbourne in the Colony of Victoria  
Comedian departed this life on the seventeenth day of  
August one thousand eight hundred and seventy five.
2. That the said John Benjamin Donoghue made  
his Will which is as I believe unrevoked and  
unaltered and thereby appointed me the sole executrix  
thereof
3. That the said Will which is herewith annexed  
marked with the letter A is as I believe the last Will  
and Testament of the said John Benjamin Donoghue deceased.
4. That the said Will was signed by the said  
John Benjamin Donoghue deceased in the presence  
of Hugh Peck of N° 6 Bank Street East in the  
said City of Melbourne Commission Agent and of  
Thomas L Shepherd of N° 6 Bank Street  
East aforesaid Gentleman.
5. That I will pay all the just debts and  
legacies of the said deceased as far as the property  
left by him will extend and the law bind me  
so to do
6. That the said John Benjamin Donoghue

had at the time of his death no real estate in the  
Colony of Victoria

7. That the said John Benjamin Donoghue had  
at the time of his death personal estate in the said  
Colony not exceeding in value Four hundred and fifty  
pounds

8. That I believe the property of the said John  
Benjamin Donoghue does not exceed in value Four  
hundred and fifty pounds

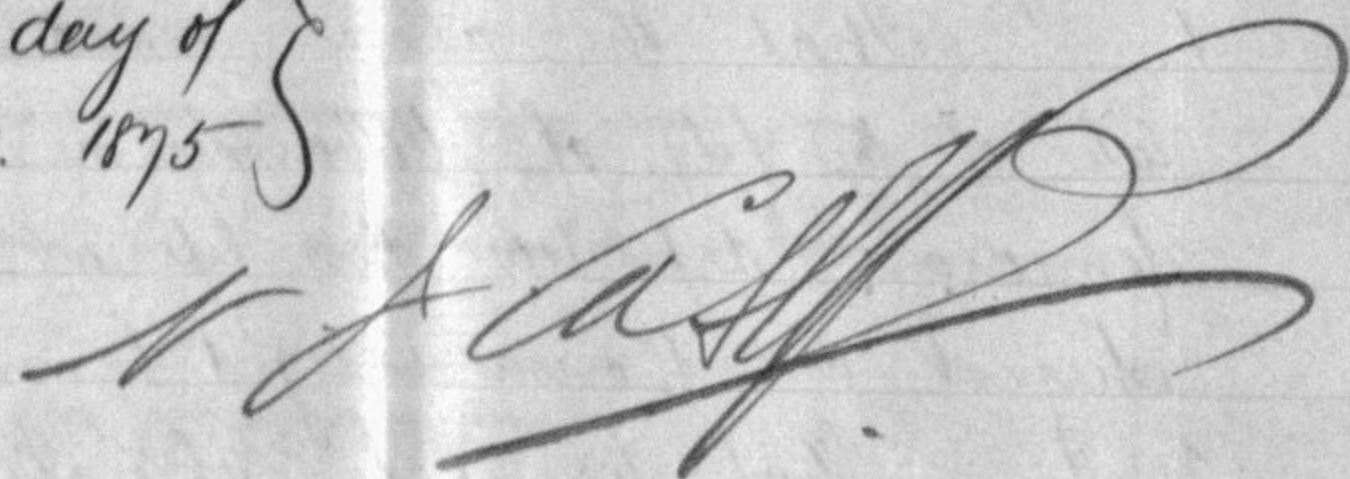

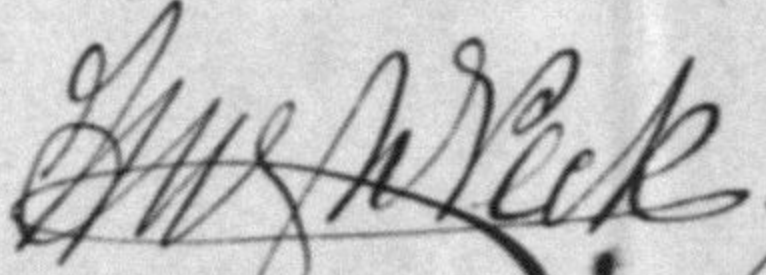

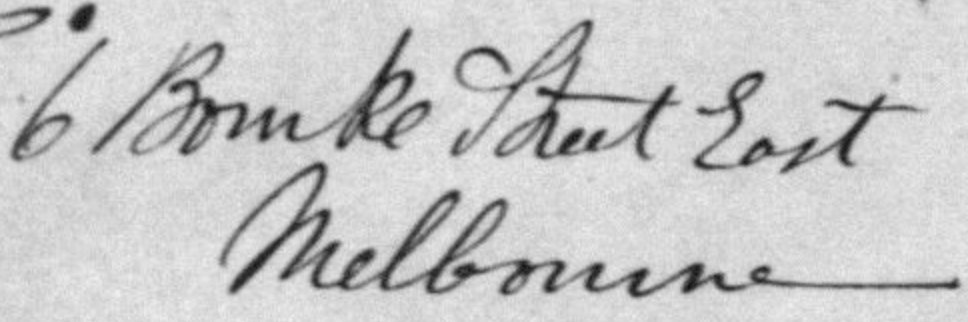

 to be my last Will and Testament  
 I do hereby give unto my dear  
 Wife Maria Louisa Dunn otherwise  
 Maria Louisa Donoghue all my real  
 and personal Estate whatsoever and  
 wheresoever as well as a Policy of  
 Insurance on my life in the London  
 and Liverpool Insurance Company  
 for the sum of Five hundred pounds  
 to hold unto her her heirs executors  
 and administrators according to the  
 respective natures and qualities of the  
 said premises absolutely and forever  
 And I hereby appoint my said  
 Wife sole executrix of this my Will

Signed by the said testator as  
 his last Will and Testament in the  
 presence of us present at the same  
 time who at his request in his  
 presence and in the presence of John Benjamin Donoghue  
 each other have subscribed our
