on his oath saith, I am a legally qualified medical practitioner  
residing at The Melbourne Hospital

The deceased Richard Ramsden was <sup>admitted</sup> ~~brought~~ to this Hospital about ten o'clock on the evening of January the third (3<sup>rd</sup>) 1894. There was complete paralysis of all four extremities and of the trunk. His breathing was diaphragmatic, the intercostal muscles not acting. There was complete loss of sensation below the shoulders. There was a wound about eight inches in length and semicircular in shape separating the hairy scalp from the bone. The deceased was partially unconscious on admission. He died on the sixth (6<sup>th</sup>) of January. The cause of death was fracture of the Cervical Spine.
