day of December One thousand eight hundred and seventy

to the best of her knowledge and ability the Estate of said
deceased at the time of his death which at
any time after shall come to the power or
control hands or possession of her or any
other person or persons for her And that
she will make or cause to be made a
true and perfect Inventory ~~ments~~ of the
Estate of the deceased which shall have
come to the hands possession or knowledge
of ~~her~~ ^{her} or any person or persons for her
And the same or made will sign with
her proper handwriting and will exhibit
and deposit or cause so to be the same
Inventory in the office of the Master in
Equity within three calendar months
next ensuing the order granting Administration
And further will make or cause to be made
a true and just Account of the

Administration of the Estate which
she has undertaken as to her receipts
and disbursements and as to what portion
is retained by her and what portion
remains uncollected. And the same
so made will sign with her proper
handwriting and will exhibit and
deposit or cause to be exhibited
and deposited the same account in
the office of the Master in Equity within
fifteen calendar months next ensuing
the order granting Administration And that
the property of deceased in Victoria does not exceed
in value the sum of £120 sterling.
