NOW the condition of the above written obligation is such that if
the above bounden Elizabeth Ann Bancroft Administratrix of all
and singular the Goods Chattels Estates Credits and Effects of the
said Richard Bancroft Deceased do and shall make and cause
to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the
Goods Chattels Credits and Effects of the said Richard Bancroft
Deceased which have or shall come into her Hands custody possession
or Knowledge of any Person or Persons for her and the same so
made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the
Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria at Melbourne aforesaid
on or about the twenty fourth day of May in the year
of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty seven and the
same Goods Chattels Credits and Effects and all other the Goods
Chattels Credits and Effects of the said Richard Bancroft Deceased
at the time of his Decease or which at any time or times after his death

Shall come to the hands or possession of the said Elizabeth Ann Bancroft or into the hands or possession of any other Person or Persons for her shall and will well and truly administer according to Law and further shall make and render or cause to be made and rendered into the said Court a true and just Account of her Administration on or before the twenty fourth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty seven and afterwards from time to time as she shall be thereunto lawfully required and all the rest and residue of the said Goods Chattels Credits and Effects which shall be from time to time remaining upon the said Administration Accounts the same being first examined and allowed by the said Court or the proper Office thereof shall and do pay and dispose of in the due course of Administration or in such manner as the said Court shall order and direct.
